Working together for Longman

With COVID-19 restrictions eased in recent months, I have been out and about in our wonderful community meeting our local schools, businesses, organisations and residents.

Here in the south of Longman, people are working hard to negotiate the social and economic impacts of the virus that continue to challenge us.

Together with our amazing State LNP candidates Yvonne Barlow (Murrumba), Kerry Petrus (Kurwongbah) and Phil Carlson (Bancroft), I have spent considerable time on the ground chatting to locals about the issues that matter to you, including access to health services, reducing crime and improving roads. Together, we are working on solutions to fix these issues.

Recently I attended the opening of the new Dakabin Woolworths where we welcomed the first customers into the store. The new Woolies created 75 local jobs and when you include the specialty stores expected to open next month, around 200 people will be employed in the shopping centre. It is such an important economic investment for the local community, and the entire region, particularly during these tough economic times.

I also visited Dakabin State School and spoke to new Principal Brendan Smith and community campaigner Gemma Gale about the need to upgrade the school's facilities and Brendan's future plans for the school.

I stopped by Narangba Timbers which has been busy of late thanks to DIY home projects gaining popularity during the COVID lockdown.

On behalf of Government Services Minister Stuart Robert, I visited Varley Group in Narangba to check out the new Mobile Service Centre they are building for Services Australia.

It was also nice to stop by outdoor power equipment business Roy Gripske & Sons at Narangba which recently hired seven new employees.

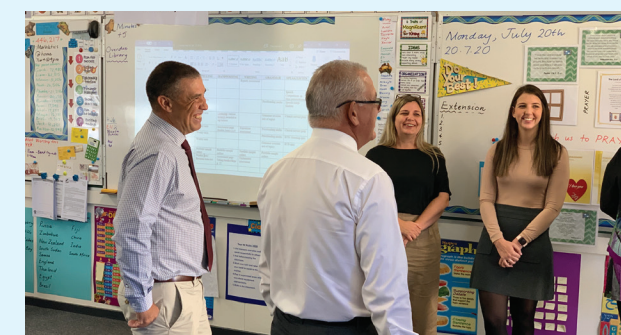

DELIVERING FOR OUR COMMUNITY

The Morrison Government's is continuing to deliver for our local community. Recent grant funding has helped to deliver:

- Outdoor Play Equipment for Northpine Christian College
- Sustainable Community Project for Dakabin State High School
- Sports equipment shed for Jinibara State School





Project update - Bruce Highway, Bribie Island Rd to Steve Irwin Way (Exit 163)

This \$662.5 million project will widen the 11km stretch of the Bruce Highway from 4 to 6 lanes between Caboolture-Bribie Island Road and Steve Irwin Way (Exit 163).

This will include upgrading creek crossings at Lagoon, King Johns, Six Mile and Beerburum Creeks. Transport and Main Roads is nearing completion of early works to relocate public utility services such as water, power and telecommunications infrastructure. Once these works are finalised, major construction can begin.

PROJECT UPDATE - BRIBIE ISLAND ROAD AND OLD TOORBUL POINT ROAD INTERSECTION

This \$30.4 million upgrade is part of a joint funding agreement between the Morrison Government (\$20 million) and Queensland Government (\$10.4 million).

Excavation works on the north-western side of the intersection to prepare for road widening continue and earthworks have also started on the north-eastern side of the intersection. Some intermittent night works will be undertaken while temporary road lighting is installed within the project area.

Construction began in mid-July and should be completed in early 2021, weather and construction conditions permitting.

This project is supporting jobs at a time when maintaining jobs has never been more critical.



CORONAVIRUS UPDATE

The Australian Government has launched a voluntary app, COVIDSafe, to help health officials notify people who may have been exposed to coronavirus.

VIRTUAL WELDING AT TAFE

Local school students were recently given hands-on welding experience using the latest 3D reality welding simulators at TAFE Queensland's Caboolture campus. It was great to see these guys using this impressive technology which was provided thanks to \$750,000 in federal government funding.

Students from Caboolture State High School, Tullawong State High School, St Columban's College, and Horizons College were all taught how to use the hi-tech simulators before going into a live workshop.

The opportunities for young people in the welding industry are huge and we saw some surprised faces when the kids learnt top earners were more than \$200,000 a year.
