### DELIVERING FOR OUR COMMUNITY

#### Woodford Show Society: Chairlift and Air-Conditioning Stronger Communities Grant

I recently visited the Woodford Show Society to chat with president Val Reichle and vice president Peter Ostman about their new chairlift and air-conditioning. Val and Peter showed me around their facilities and told me how much of a difference this chairlift would make in their daily operations. Sadly COVID-19 put an end to this year's show, but the society is determined to put on an event next year the whole community can enjoy.



#### Woodford Golf Club: Car Park Expansion Stronger Communities Grant

I visited Pat Atee at the Woodford Golf Club and was able to see how our investment of \$12,500 was put to good use in a much-needed car park expansion which also made it much safer for golfers. Previously during busy days, people were parking under the nearby trees and Pat had concerns over safety with falling branches. Thanks to this funding, the club has more space to park on those busy Saturdays.







### Project update - Bruce Highway, Bribie Island Rd to Steve Irwin Way (Exit 163)

This \$662.5 million project will widen the 11km stretch of the Bruce Highway from 4 to 6 lanes between Caboolture-Bribie Island Road and Steve Irwin Way (Exit 163).

This will include upgrading creek crossings at Lagoon, King Johns, Six Mile and Beerburum Creeks. Transport and Main Roads is nearing completion of early works to relocate public utility services such as water, power and telecommunications infrastructure. Once these works are finalised, major construction can begin.

## PROJECT UPDATE - BRIBIE ISLAND ROAD AND OLD TOORBUL POINT ROAD INTERSECTION

This \$30.4 million upgrade is part of a joint funding agreement between the Morrison Government (\$20 million) and Queensland Government (\$10.4 million).

Excavation works on the north-western side of the intersection to prepare for road widening continue and earthworks have also started on the north-eastern side of the intersection. Some intermittent night works will be undertaken while temporary road lighting is installed within the project area.

Construction began in mid-July and should be completed in early 2021, weather and construction conditions permitting.

This project is supporting jobs at a time when maintaining jobs has never been more critical.



## CORONAVIRUS UPDATE

The Australian Government has launched a voluntary app, COVIDSafe, to help health officials notify people who may have been exposed to coronavirus.

## VIRTUAL WELDING AT TAFE

Local school students were recently given hands-on welding experience using the latest 3D reality welding simulators at TAFE Queensland's Caboolture campus. It was great to see these guys using this impressive technology which was provided thanks to \$750,000 in federal government funding.

Students from Caboolture State High School, Tullawong State High School, St Columban's College, and Horizons College were all taught how to use the hi-tech simulators before going into a live workshop.

The opportunities for young people in the welding industry are huge and we saw some surprised faces when the kids learnt top earners were more than \$200,000 a year.
